From the Parish Priest – Vicar

As The Anglican Parish of Greater Hastings we are characterised with a dynamic of gathering and sending, welcoming all, worshipping God, nourishing community and empowering action. We are to gather people in with liturgical worship, events and other functions, by providing a spiritual home for Christians (not only Anglicans), and a safe space for people of other faiths (currently Sikh, Hindu, Muslim), and for those who are yet uncommitted (those of no articulated faith).

We look forward to welcoming everyone regardless of culture, language or faith. We extend the same welcome as the child in the manager at Epiphany, the revelation of Christ to all the world.

In Christ there is neither Jew nor Gentile; i roto i a te Karaiti, kāhore he tangata whenua, kāhore he tauiwi; in Christ there is no discrimination of gender, class or race.

The Epiphany is a feast day which points us to something far greater. It is when we give thanks that God is made known to all the world in Jesus Christ. The wise men, the kings, the magi, the scholars who studied the stars illustrate that Jesus is the great king to whom the whole earth paid homage. They suggest that all races, creeds, and ages need Christ.

In gathering and sending we are to represent the face of Christ and offer hope, grace and love. We are to be a sacred space and a public space. We are to be the turangawaewae, the standing ground, for the people of Hastings, Hawke's Bay, and beyond. We are to be a place where all feel welcome and can say this is my place, I belong here.

In gathering and sending we are to represent the face of Christ and offer Manaaki – kindness & compassion, Humarie – goodwill & peace and Aroha – love.



In gathering and sending we share our resources with the wider community, fulfilling our role as a Christian church within Hastings. We are a place to celebrate and lament, pray and debate. We need to be a place where God is revealed in word, action and sacrament. A place that takes seriously our Christian calling to service, justice and peace for all God's creation. A place for people of all ages, races and creeds.

Our sacred spaces offer opportunities for engagement and demonstration of holiness and for people when they gather to experience activities performed in the name of Christ which they may never otherwise experience.

Much of what we do at church is countercultural because we are seen to maintain liturgy and music, teaching and preaching, and a rhythm of weekly public prayer in a changing context.

This will lead toward Confirmation for those who wish in early July. If you are keen to explore adult Baptism or Confirmation please join in our Lenten worship as a starting point.

Sunday 19: Lent 4 – Mothering / Refreshment Sunday. 5.30pm. St Matthew's, Hastings – Lenten Worship – Ordered For Ministry.

Sunday 26: Lent 5 – Passion Sunday. 5.30pm. St Matthew's, Hastings – Lenten Worship – Directed By God's Mission.

Sunday 2: Lent 6 – PALM SUNDAY – The passion of our Lord. 5.30pm. St Matthew's, Hastings – Lenten Worship – Being Anglican Here.

Out of these those who wish to explore adult Baptism will meet a couple of times as we prepare for Baptism and Renewal of Baptismal Vows at Easter.

As the Church we are called to TEACH:

- Nurture To teach, baptise, and nurture new believers.
- Helping people grow in the faith deepening their connection with a church community.
 - Renewal of Baptismal Promises annually at Easter Vigil and / or Easter Day worship.
 - Annual or 2 Yearly Confirmation or Reaffirmation / Renewal of Confirmation Promises when Bishop attends Parish. Sunday 2 July 2023.



 Observe, celebrate, commemorate High Days and Holy Days, such as Patronal Festivals, All Saints' & All Souls', and special awareness days such as Disability & Social Services Sunday.

As The Anglican Parish of Greater Hastings we are doing these well. As faith communities this is part of our getting back to the basics and succeeding in our achievements.

Baptism and the Renewal of Baptismal Vows will be the focus of our Easter Worship



Baptism

Baptism is a Sacrament. 'A sacrament is an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace'. A sacrament is a sign in that it points to something other than itself, but it is more than a sign in that it gives an inward and spiritual grace to the person who receives it.

We baptise because Jesus commanded us to baptise. Jesus' teaching about baptism is clearly stated in his discussion with Nicodemus (John 3:1-8). This is not an easy concept to understand, but it is a vital part of our Christian experience.

When someone is baptised, that person is brought to Jesus Christ, and made a member of Christ's Church. It is a new start to life in which the baptised person is accepted and sealed by God with the Holy Spirit to represent Christ to the world. As a response to the baptism which God gives us, we declare our faith and intention to serve Christ, and ask for God's continuing grace to support us in the task to which we are called.

Through prayer and fellowship within the body of Christ God strengthens and nourishes us.

In summary, Baptism is the sacrament by which we are made children of God, members of Christ's body the Church and heirs to the realm of God.

Water is the outward and visible sign by which a person is baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Those seeking baptism need to renounce evil and turn from sin to Christ as the Way, the Truth and the Life.

Most importantly is the spiritual truth that our faith begins not with what we do for God, but what God does for us.

Alister recalls his Baptism and what it means for him (and maybe) you

A few weeks ago, I celebrated the anniversary of my baptism. It so happens I can remember the event as I was nine years old and got to choose my godparents and the priest who baptised me. On my anniversary, I took time to be still with the gift of what my baptism has come to mean for me – to celebrate (as our Prayer Book puts it), 'being made a child of God, member of the Christ's body, the Church, and an heir of the Kingdom of God.'

You may not recall your baptism as most Anglicans are baptised when they are very young. But age doesn't matter as our baptism is first and foremost God's act – it's what God does for us.

God is the one who takes the initiative - God reaches out to us before we ever think of reaching out to God. Then, over time, we grow into what it means for us, and we learn how to respond. At Easter we renew our baptismal promises, and the priest sprinkles us with copious amounts of holy water. It's an opportunity to renew that response.

My baptism tells me that I'm God's beloved child. That's my most fundamental, treasured, and enduring identity – more important to me than being a husband and father and priest.

It's a relationship that we believe will transcend even death. As a child of God, I'm a member of the family of Christ, the Church – which, of course, makes me your brother.

As the baptised we've got a job to do. The priest says to a newly baptised child, 'May you grow in the Holy Spirit, fulfil your ministry and follow Christ your whole life long.' Translated: YOU, the baptised, ARE A MINISTER. And our job is to make the love of God real in this world. And by the way, there's no 'best before date' or 'use by date' on your baptism.

Until the day we die, we're called to make God's love real to others – to proclaim by our actions and our words the good news of God in Christ.

So, I wonder, what does your baptism means for you. Perhaps this Lent and Easter you may discover a new meaning.



This is us: who we are as Anglicans

These studies are suitable for both small groups and for individuals to do on their own. They will be sent out by email, ready for printing, to parishes and clergy on 1 February, and also to any individuals who request them.

This study addresses the lack of confidence I've observed in the church over the last few years (or maybe even longer) – a lack of confidence in who we are and what we have to offer.

People speak enviously of other denominations which they think have the best tunes, the most enticing worship, and larger youth groups. Yet the Anglican church, here in Aotearoa New Zealand and elsewhere, has so much to recommend it in terms of our way of being church, in liturgy, values, and mission.

It is hoped that this study will help us get over the "I'm Anglican" mumble and develop a sense of confidence in who we are.

Messy Church Greater Hastings has two gatherings. Messy Church St Matthew's meets on the second Saturday of the month at the Church Hall, 200 King Street South and Messy Church St Martin's meets on the last Saturday of the month at St Martin's Community Hall, 1120 Willowpark Road North. They start at 4pm and finish around 6pm.

Messy Church was first established in 2004 in The Anglican Parish of St Wilfrid's in Cowplain, near Portsmouth in England, and has now spread to 29 countries. The principles are Christ-centred, for all ages, based on creativity, hospitality and celebration. Any Christian denomination can have a Messy Church.



Each of our gatherings in Hastings brings together around 30 people. Some attend both Messy Churches. The sessions start with crafts, then a celebration time of teaching and worship, and then a meal. All this is free although a koha is welcome. It is a time of enjoyment, learning, worship and making new friends.

Why is it called Messy Church? Yes, life does sometimes become 'messy'. However it is because in England in 2004, when they were wondering what to call this new venture, a young participant said MESSY church and it is such an appropriate name. There can be paints, sometimes clay, and sometimes things get messy and that is alright. You do not need to sit still. You can choose a craft or just do colouring in. Everyone is a welcome participant. Your age or ability is immaterial.

I first met Mickey at Colwyn House Lifecare where I am the Chaplain and Mickey was working as a Diversional Therapist. Mickey and I got chatting about faith (Catholic – Anglican), professional training, COVID-19, and interests.

Mickey told me about how getting COVID meant he had time to reengage with a passion of art. I thought he was talking about a few doodles on a page, then he said that reengaging had led to putting a proposal in for The Big Apple Project. This idea developed into Actualizing Tendency <u>https://www.thebigapple.co.nz/actualizing-</u> tendency/ an apple which I found most inspiring.

Mickey has a degree in Psychology. Before moving

to Aotearoa New Zealand from the Philippines he was a Psychometrician and university psychology lecturer. He is currently working to have his academic qualifications accredited here.

He now works at the Hawke's Bay Fallen Soldiers Memorial Hospital as a Therapist Assistant. Many of the immigrants I meet through ministry are highly qualified professionals assisting our labour force where they can. Some of these wonderful people have trained and worked as Neo-natal Intensive Care Nurses, Prescribing Optometrists, Dentists and Psychologists in their home country and around the world before choosing to live here in Aotearoa New Zealand.

Out of our conversations I invited Mickey to use St Matthew's to host an Art Exhibition. In asking Mickey to exhibit I have suggested that a percentage of sales be gifted to Anglican Missions for ministry to those less fortunate than us.
