

Alister Hendery (Priest Associate) writes

... the matter of money

Money matters. It's an important issue in most people's lives. Without it we can't survive, let alone do many of the things we want to do.

Many of us have enough money. Sure, some days I'd like more... but I have sufficient, and for that I'm deeply grateful, for I'm very aware of those who don't have enough... who struggle to make ends meet.

Money matters. Yet, in the church, we're often reluctant to talk about it... and when someone like me starts on about it, we may switch off. However, just as it matters in your personal life, so the matter of money is significant in the life of our parish.

This year our parish has a budget of \$400,000, of which, over a third needs to be met from our direct personal giving.

What you and I give ensures we continue as a vibrant parish in Hastings... as we have since 1895. And what about the future? Do we value the life of our parish enough to see it continue for many years to come... beyond our lifetime? So, there's the question of what we give today, but I wonder, how about leaving a bequest to benefit the future.

Having said that... what's most important is that the matter of money is significant because it mattered to Jesus. Next to the kingdom of heaven, it was the subject Jesus most frequently talked about. Why? Because it rivals the place that God has in our lives. How we use the money we have, says something about how much God matters to us. And our willingness to give some of our money away is a response to that challenge. It's our way of saying thanks for all that we've received... from others... from God... Let's echo the words of the priest and hymn writer, George Herbert:



A group of parishioners were asked, 'Why do you give, and how do you do it? This is what they said...

• I give away a proportion of my money because I'm so grateful for what I've received. I look back over my life, and the best thing I can say is, 'Thanks God!' I've known some tough financial times, but at the end of the day the biggest thing I see are the blessings... I see how I've received from God, especially through the love, and care, and support of God's people.

It's my responsibility as a Christian to give to my local church. And yes, I'm also very aware of the financial challenges we face as a parish today – and that challenges me to see if I can give more. So, I ask myself, does my giving reflect my sense of responsibility?

I give based on a percentage of my total income – so as my income goes up or down, my giving reflects that.

I don't see the money that's goes out of my bank account once a month as the payment of a bill. It's part of my worship. It's my way of saying, 'Here God is a bit of my life and my work – a part of what I've received.' The way I see it, is that all I have is a gift from God. And what I give – of my time, my skills, and my experience, and my money – is a way of giving thanks to God.

• I think of these words from two of my favourite hymns:

'Love so amazing so divine / Demands my soul my life my all.' ...

'All I've needed your hand has provided / Great is thy faithfulness Lord unto me.' And from our Prayer Book:

'Our hands were empty, and you filled them.'

'Of your own we give you.'

That's why I give... God has given us all gifts and talents to use for the good of our families, our community, and the church.

I believe everything that we have is a gift through the grace and kindness of God.

 I give because I believe we're custodians of God's work, and we're called to continue that work into the future.

'God loves a happy giver.' When I give it makes me happy. The amount that I give is based on what I have available at the time. However, I do find, the more I give, the happier and more pleased I am!



Parish Priest – Vicar's Ponderings

July is a busy month; some might say too busy. Our main focus will be on Stewardship – how we care for what God's has so generously provided us as a Parish and how we can offer back to God generously from what God has provided us as individuals, couples, family & whanau.

A Steward is someone who has charge of something for someone else. It means anyone who is responsible for the use of the abilities and possessions God has given. This is not just about money, but also talents and time. We are held accountable for how we use our abilities. Whatever our possessions and wealth are they are really God's, given to us for a time to use wisely.

On Saturday 22 July, 10am – 2.30pm, Rev'd. Alister Hendery will be leading a Whole-of-Parish Quiet Day Retreat. The theme questions are: 'What's my ministry? What's God asking of me?' It is important for all of us to set some time aside to reflect on where God is calling us within and outside of the church walls.

In July I will be taking some time out for Annual Leave & Retreat. In August Alister will be on Annual Leave. In August we will focus on local and global mission. During this Missions Month we will explore how we can better support Anglican Missions and New Zealand Church Missionary Society our mission agencies, and therefore our mission agencies of choice. We will also ask during this time how we can assist our RSE workers better in this upcoming season?

In the midst of all this above we have some very special Sundays – Social Services, Religious Vocations, and Anglican Communion. All of these offer us opportunities to share our faith in different ways and invite guests into our midst.

Finally, the Eucharist (Holy Communion, Mass, Lord's Supper) is a central sacrament for us, the source and highlight of all Christian worship. It has the most prominent place in the rhythm of parish worship. On Sunday morning at 8am & 10am St Matthew's, Hastings or 10am St Peter's, Riverslea, and on Thursday morning at 10.15am at St Matthew's, Hastings. All of these are based on the liturgies of A New Zealand Prayer Book – He Karakia Mihinare O Aotearoa. Both Sunday 10am Eucharists include music that draws us to prayer through singing of congregational music. The 8am and mid-week service are said Eucharists without music.


