## Psalm 139:1-5, 12-18

- Lord you have searched me out and known me: you know when I sit down and when I stand up, you discern my thoughts from afar.
- You mark my path, and the places where I rest: you are acquainted with all my ways.
- Even before there is a word on my tongue: **you Lord know it altogether.**
- You guard me from behind and before: **and cover me with your hand.**
- Such knowledge is too wonderful for me: so high that I cannot attain to it.
- Where shall I go from your spirit: or where shall I flee from your presence?
- I will praise you, for you are awesome and wonderful: marvellous are your works, and you know me through and through.
- My body was not hidden from you: when I was being fashioned in secret, and woven together in the depths of the earth.
- Your eyes looked at my body: while it was as yet imperfectly formed.

In your book all the days of my life were written: while as yet there was not one of them.

How deep are your thoughts O God: and how great is the sum of them.
