From the Parish Priest - Vicar

As The Anglican Parish of Greater Hastings we are characterised with a dynamic of gathering and sending, welcoming all, worshipping God, nourishing community and empowering action. We are to gather people in with liturgical worship, events and other functions, by providing a spiritual home for Christians (not only Anglicans), and a safe space for people of other faiths (currently Sikh, Hindu, Muslim), and for those who are yet uncommitted (those of no articulated faith).

We look forward to welcoming everyone regardless of culture, language or faith. We extend the same welcome as the child in the manager at Epiphany, the revelation of Christ to all the world.

In Christ there is neither Jew nor Gentile; i roto i a te Karaiti, kāhore he tangata whenua, kāhore he tauiwi; in Christ there is no discrimination of gender, class or race.



The Epiphany is a feast day which points us to something far greater. It is when we give thanks that God is made known to all the world in Jesus Christ. The wise men, the kings, the magi, the scholars who studied the stars illustrate that Jesus is the great king to whom the whole earth paid homage. They suggest that all races, creeds, and ages need Christ.

In gathering and sending we are to represent the face of Christ and offer hope, peace, joy and love. We are to be a sacred space and a public space. We are to be the turangawaewae, the standing ground, for the people of Hastings, Hawke's Bay, and beyond. We are to be a place where all feel welcome and can say this is my place, I belong here. In gathering and sending we are to represent the face of Christ revealing Jesus' life to all the world. By doing this we are no longer Christ's servants, but knowing his will, we become Jesus' friends.

In gathering and sending we share our resources with the wider community, fulfilling our role as a Christian church within Hastings. We are a place to celebrate and lament, pray and debate. We need to be a place where God is revealed in word, action and sacrament. A place that takes seriously our Christian calling to service, justice and peace for all God's creation. A place for people of all ages, races and creeds.

Our sacred spaces offer opportunities for engagement and demonstration of holiness and for people when they gather to experience activities performed in the name of Christ which they may never otherwise experience. We are provoking faith in Hastings' communities, for example St Matthew's Church is a premier worship space, civic, arts and cultural venue.

Much of what we do at church is countercultural because we are seen to maintain liturgy and music, teaching and preaching, and a rhythm of weekly public prayer in a changing context.

Fundamentally I believe we are well placed to proclaim the realm of God and live out The Five Marks of Mission which express the Anglican Communion's common commitment to, and understanding of, God's holistic and integral mission. The mission of the Church is the mission of Christ.



- To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom
- To teach, baptise & nurture new believers
- To respond to human need by loving service
- To transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind & pursue peace & reconciliation
- To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, & sustain & renew the life of the earth

I believe we are living out well what we are called to be. Through our words, actions, music, and inclusion we can be proud and thankful that we have been able to be a place that lives and breathes welcome and hospitality, a turangawaewae for all. A place of sacred and civic co-operation, a place where diverse languages, cultures, genders, and faiths can be expressed and valued.

As individuals and communities of faith we need to continue to be bridge builders, companions and friends on our faith journeys. Listening and watching where the Spirit is leading us and never being complacent or inattentive to the needs in God's world. We need to be encouraging others to see Christ's love and reconciliation in our unity in diversity and so to know that hope, peace, joy and love that is in Jesus Christ.

Shrove Tuesday

About 6-7 weeks before Easter comes the Season of Lent. The 40 days of Lent remember a special time in Jesus' life. He grew up and



worked as a builder-carpenter. Then, he began new work – telling people about God. To get ready he spent 40 days alone in the desert, going without food and thinking of all that lay ahead.

Shrove is a very old word which people hardly use anymore. It means 'forgiven' There is a tradition among Christians of saying sorry to God for doing wrong things, and of remembering their belief that God forgives them.

Shrove Tuesday is known by other names: Pancake Day, Party Tuesday, Mardi Gras / Fat Tuesday.... In some places, people have a carnival on Party Tuesday. It is a Mardi Gras festival. At the carnival, people were amazing costumes in a big parade, and then they enjoy a party together.

Lent is a time when Christians try to live more simply than usual so they have more time to think about God. But first comes a feast, to use up any rich foods! This is Shrove Tuesday. In days gone by, the rich foods people had were creamy milk and eggs. They used these to make pancakes before the start of Lent. A Pancake Party!

We are going to have a pancake feast.

Baptism

Baptism is a Sacrament. 'A sacrament is an outward and visible sign of an inward and spiritual grace'. A sacrament is a sign in that it points to something other than itself, but it is more than a sign in that it gives an inward and spiritual grace to the person who receives it.

We baptise because Jesus commanded us to baptise. Jesus' teaching about baptism is clearly stated in his discussion with Nicodemus (John 3:1-8). This is not an easy concept to understand, but it is a vital part of our Christian experience.

When someone is baptised, that person is brought to Jesus Christ, and made a member of Christ's Church. It is a new start to life in which the baptised person is accepted and sealed by God with the Holy Spirit to represent Christ to the world.

As a response to the baptism which God gives us, we declare our faith and intention to serve Christ, and ask for God's continuing grace to support us in the task to which we are called.

Through prayer and fellowship within the body of Christ God strengthens and nourishes us.

In summary, Baptism is the sacrament by which we are made children of God, members of Christ's body the Church and heirs to the realm of God.

Water is the outward and visible sign by which a person is baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Those seeking baptism need to renounce evil and turn from sin to Christ as the Way, the Truth and the Life.

Most importantly is the spiritual truth that our faith begins not with what we do for God, but what God does for us.



Denis Hancock, 1943-2024

I wonder, how will you remember Denis Hancock?

For so many people in Hastings the lasting memory will be of the man who, for nearly 40 years, rode his bike around our city streets, picking up rubbish. Several newspaper articles were written about Denis. In one of them, the interviewer asked Denis why he did this rubbish collecting exercise. Denis' reply, "I hate rubbish. Don't you?" He explained what made him such an avid rubbish collector, "I remember going for drives with my father when I was a kid, and I'd see all the rubbish along the side of the road. I wanted to do something about it... It seems to make a difference." Over the years, this involved voluntary occupation various campaigns as he targeted certain suburbs or parks. At his peak Denis filled 1,000 rubbish bags a month.

For his efforts, Denis was recognised by various mayors and organisations. He was given a civic honour for community service and received accolades from Keep New Zealand Beautiful. In the words of a fellow parishioner, "Denis' dedication to keeping Hastings clean brought out the determination in him and he stuck at it, despite being taunted and targeted by many ignorant people. He woke people up to the litter that was so casually discarded back in the past, including the Council... Well done Denis, you were a humble man but have left a wonderful gift and legacy to your hometown."

There were other dimensions to Denis' life. He loved painting, in particular landscapes. Music was a vital part of his life.

He began singing in choirs as a teenager, then as a member of a choral group for decades and was a member of the parish choir at St Matthew's.

Denis was a very regular worshipper at St Matthew's - often the first to arrive on a Sunday morning. His faith meant so much to him and the church community was like a family to him. In his unique way Denis showed us what really matters in life. I asked one his friends what he was most grateful for when he thought of Denis. His reply, "Thanks for Denis being Denis." That's a profound response, for it's how God regards us. We're treasured for being who we are. We don't choose our talents, our disabilities, our temperaments. But each of us is chosen to show and make real aspects of God's love to the world. Denis most certainly did this - by his care for our environment, by his honesty, humility, and straightforward approach to life.

We give thanks for Denis Hancock. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.
