Lighting of the Easter Candle

As we rejoice in the gift of Christ's risen presence we say:

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, **Iesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,** in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Open to me the gates of the temple: that I may enter and give thanks to the Lord.

The Sermon

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the Easter mystery we have died and been buried with him in Baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life within the family of his Church. I invite us to renew the promises made at Baptism, affirming our allegiance to Christ, and our rejection of all that is evil.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Those who are baptised are called to worship and serve God. From the beginning, believers have continued in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers.

Will you commit yourself to this life? I will, with God's help.

Will you forgive others as you are forgiven? I will, with God's help.

Will you seek to love your neighbour as yourself, and strive for peace and justice? I will, with God's help.

Will you accept the cost of following Jesus Christ in your daily life and work?

I will, with God's help.

With the whole Church will you proclaim by word and action the Good News of God in Christ? I will, with God's help.

Praise God who made heaven and earth, whose promise endures for ever.

We thank you God for your love in all creation, especially for your gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life. We thank you that through the waters of baptism you cleanse us, renew us by your Spirit and raise us to new life. In the new covenant we are made members of your Church and share in your eternal kingdom.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to Christ, we celebrate our fellowship in him through faith.

We pray that all who pass through the waters of baptism may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour.

Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom, thanksgiving and honour, power and might, be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!

A hymn is sung as the priest sprinkles us with the baptismal waters.

Almighty Father, grant that we your children may never be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, but continue his faithful servants to our lives' end; through Jesus Christ our Redeemer. **Amen.**

The Prayers of the People

Let us pray for the Church and for the world, giving thanks for God's goodness.

We sit.

Praise and honour to you Lord Jesus, for you have triumphed gloriously.

We pray for the world: for those in positions of authority, especially those who have the power to bring peace to those places inflicted with conflict.

Roll away the stones of hatred and animosity.

Transform us with your spirit of justice and peace that all people may share in the freedom of your risen life. Risen God, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Praise and honour to you Lord Jesus, for you have cancelled the power of sin.

We pray for the worldwide church:

for those who minister within our parish of Greater Hastings, and all who renew their baptismal promises today.

Roll away the stones of discord and unbelief. Transform your church with your spirit of wisdom and truth that we may witness to your risen life. Risen God, in your mercy,

hear our prayer.

Praise and honour to you Lord Jesus, for you show us the power of love. We pray for the communities in which we live and work: for our families, friends and all whom we love; for those who are forgotten and undervalued. Roll away the stones of apathy and selfishness. Transform our lives with your spirit of love and forgiveness that we may share in the joy of your risen life. Risen God, in your mercy,

hear our prayer.

Praise and honour to you Lord Jesus, for you bring us hope when all seems lost. We pray for those who suffer: for the lonely and friendless; for the sick and sorrowing and all who care for them. Roll away the stones of pain and despair. Transform the lives of all who suffer with your comfort that they may share in the hope of your risen life. Risen God, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Praise and honour to you Lord Jesus, for you have broken the bonds of death. We give thanks for your people of every age who have followed you in trust and love. Transform our lives, by your risen power, that we, with all your saints, may share in the glory of your risen life. Risen God, in your mercy,

hear our prayer.

The Great Thanksgiving

We remain standing, though feel free to sit if needs be.

The Lord is here.

God's Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to offer thanks and praise.

Honour and worship are indeed your due, our Lord and our God, through Jesus Christ, for you created all things; by your will they were created, and for your glory they have their being. In your loving purpose you chose us before the foundation of the world to be your people. Above all we give you thanks and praise for your grace in sending Jesus Christ, when we had turned away from you.

In your Son you suffered with us and for us, calling us to freedom and holiness.
You raised him to life triumphant over death; you exalted him in glory.
By his victory over death, the reign of sin is ended, a new age has dawned, a broken world is restored and we are made whole once more.

Therefore with people of every nation, tribe and language, with the whole Church on earth and in heaven, joyfully we give you thanks and say:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

All glory and honour to you, God of grace, for you gave your only Son Jesus Christ once for all on the cross to be the one perfect sacrifice for the sin of the world, that all who believe in him might have eternal life. The night before he died, he took bread, and when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup, and when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them and said:
Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember me.

Therefore heavenly Father, in this sacrament of the suffering and death of your Son, we now celebrate the wonder of your grace and proclaim mystery of our faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come in glory.

Redeemer God, rich in mercy, infinite in goodness, we were far off until you brought us near and our hands are empty until you fill them. As we eat this bread and drink this wine, through the power of your Holy Spirit feed us with your heavenly food, renew us in your service, unite us in Christ, as we offer you our songs of everlasting praise.

Blessing, honour and glory be yours, here and everywhere now and forever. Amen.
