The Gathering of the Community

Opening Hymn:

We sit or kneel

God our Creator, you have made all things good, but we do not love you with all our heart, and with all our soul, and with all our mind, and with all our strength. Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy. Jesus our friend, you forgive our sins, but we do not forgive and befriend each other. Christ, have mercy. **Christ, have mercy.**

Holy Spirit, you love us and live in us, but we often find it difficult to love ourselves. Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

God has promised forgiveness to all who truly repent, turn to Christ in faith and are themselves forgiving.

In silence we call to mind our sins.

Silence

Let us confess our sins.

Merciful God, we have sinned in what we have thought and said, in the wrong we have done and in the good we have not done. We have sinned in ignorance: we have sinned in weakness: we have sinned through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry. We repent and turn to you. Forgive us, for our Saviour Christ's sake, and renew our lives to the glory of your name. Amen.

Through the cross of Christ, God have mercy on you, pardon you and set you free. Know that you are forgiven and be at peace. God strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in life eternal. **Amen.** The peace of Christ rule in our hearts. **The word of Christ dwell in us richly.**

Most merciful God, by the passion of your Son Jesus Christ you delivered us from the power of darkness; grant that through faith in him who suffered on the cross we may be found acceptable in your sight, through our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Proclamation

First reading: Numbers 21:4–9 The serpents bring havoc to complaining, hungry Hebrews. Moses creates a bronze serpent as an antidote, a symbol still used in the pharmaceutical industry.

After the reading: Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church. **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm 107:1-3, 17-22

'O give thanks, for the Lord is gracious: God's steadfast love endures for ever.'

So let the people say whom the Lord has redeemed: whom the Lord has redeemed from the hand of the enemy,

and gathered out of the lands, from the east and from the west: from the north and from the south.

Some were sick because of their sins: afflicted on account of their wrongdoing.

They loathed every kind of food: and drew near to the gates of death.

Then they cried to you O Lord in their trouble: and you rescued them from their distress.

You sent forth your word and healed them: and saved their life from the grave.

Let them thank you O Lord for your steadfast love: for the wonders that you do for us.

Let them offer the sacrifice of thanksgiving: and tell of your deeds with shouts of joy.

John makes reference to today's first reading. But it is Christ lifted up on the cross that is salvation for all, despite people's rejection of him.

After the reading: This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to Christ the Word.**

The Great Thanksgiving

We remain standing though feel free to sit if needs be.

The Lord is here. **God's Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to offer thanks and praise.**

Honour and worship are indeed your due, our Lord and our God, through Jesus Christ, for you created all things; by your will they were created, and for your glory they have their being.

In your loving purpose you chose us before the foundation of the world to be your people; you gave your promises to Abraham and Sarah and bestowed your favour on the Virgin Mary. Above all we give you thanks and praise for your grace in sending Jesus Christ, not for any merit of our own but when we had turned away from you.

We were bound in sin, but in your compassion you redeemed us, reconciling us to yourself with the precious blood of Christ.

In your Son you suffered with us and for us, offering us the healing riches of salvation and calling us to freedom and holiness. Though tempted in every way as we are, yet he did not sin; through him therefore we may triumph over sin and grow in grace.

Therefore with people of every nation, tribe and language, with the whole Church on earth and in heaven, joyfully we give you thanks and say:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

All glory and honour to you, God of grace, for you gave your only Son Jesus Christ once for all on the cross to be the one perfect sacrifice for the sin of the world, that all who believe in him might have eternal life. The night before he died, he took bread, and when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup, and when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember me.

Therefore heavenly Father, in this sacrament of the suffering and death of your Son, we now celebrate the wonder of your grace and proclaim the mystery of our faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come in glory.

Redeemer God, rich in mercy, infinite in goodness, we were far off until you brought us near and our hands are empty until you fill them. As we eat this bread and drink this wine, through the power of your Holy Spirit feed us with your heavenly food, renew us in your service, unite us in Christ, and bring us to your everlasting kingdom. O the depths and riches of your wisdom, O God; how unsearchable are your judgments and untraceable your ways.

From you, and through you, and for you are all things. To you be the glory for ever. Amen.

The Communion

As Christ teaches us we pray

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

The priest breaks the bread in silence and then says

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

We who are many are one body, for we all share the one bread.

Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us. Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world, give us your peace.

The Invitation
