WHAT DO STIPENDED CLERGY DO?

An insight into the rhythm of life of a Parish Priest by the Reverend David van Oeveren.

On the 26 July I was planning to celebrate my third anniversary as the Archdeacon of Hawke's Bay Cities. However, on 12 July 2024 Bishop Andrew withdrew the Licences of members of the Episcopal Ministry Team, including all Archdeacons. This was followed up by all Stipended Clergy meeting with Bishop Andrew in late July. This has been a fascinating opportunity to reflect on ministry as Vicar, and a Parish Priest and what the priorities are for me at this time.

As the Vicar/Parish Priest, I get to be and do many wonderful things for us, with our communities, alongside an excellent team and diverse parish communities. My role is to support, manage and enable all the wonderful mission and ministry that is happening; and to guide the Parish in a direction that is sustainable long-term and open to new opportunities; so that our Faith Communities continue beyond us, and to create a space that is safe for everyone.



PARISH WORSHIP

One of the most important roles is to ensure that we maintain a regular pattern of worship which includes Sunday and mid-week services. Added to these are special occasions such as Order of St John Church Parade, Social Services Sunday, Matariki, and Religious Vocation Sunday. Alister and I are also involved in Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and Internments, which cannot be planned for but are imperative to respond to.

As well as worship in the Sacred and Sacramental space, there is also in the Secular and Civic space, an area we are well respected for. It is important for us to be seen as faith communities of welcome and hospitality who offer a vibrant Christian spirituality and a rich sacramental life and theology in the public sphere.

GOVERNANCE

As Vicar, I attend a number of Board and Committee meetings, some of which I Chair. Starting in the Parish there is Vestry and Board of Proprietors Representative on the school Board of Trustees. I Chair the Overseas Mission – Tikanga Pakeha Sub-Committee of Anglican Missions, and am also on the Standing Committee of the Waiapu Diocese and a General Synod Te Hinota Whanui Representative for the Diocese. I Chair the Hawke's Bay Area Committee of Hato Hone St John in my own time as a volunteer.

Alongside this I engage with the Hastings City Business Association and Hawke's Bay Interfaith.

VISITING, HOSPITALITY, CHAPLAINCY AND PASTORAL CARE

A major component of my ministry is in these areas. Visiting or meeting with people, in their place, church space, or over a coffee or a meal. As communities of faith we are striving to be



more intentional about offering outrageously generous hospitality, especially for special events and when we have guests in our midst. Pastoral Care is central to both Alister's and my ministries. We might be busy, but we always have time for you.

Alister and I hold a number of chaplaincies within our Parish work which include Rest Homes and Care Centres, Heretaunga Seniors, Early Childhood and Primary School. We are recognised as the go-to people in a number of community organisations and workplaces around the Parish. As Parish Priest – Vicar it is my role to lead the work to grow and sustain our faith communities and this includes networking and working with various stakeholders to ensure our long-term future sustainability.

ECUMENICAL, INTERFAITH AND MULTICULTURAL DIALOGUE

One of the delights of Greater Hastings has been the work across denominations, particularly Catholic and Presbyterian, and beginning to network in the Interfaith space. Through networking opportunities opened up by the Co-Governance and Tangata Tiriti, as well as Interfaith and work with Cranford Hospice, we are starting to build relationships within the Multicultural Association.

ADMINISTRATION, MANAGEMENT, REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

Whilst both Alister and I focus on Ministry and Mission, inevitably we also need to tend to the wider running of the Parish. These are time consuming parts of our endeavours. The Anglican Parish of Greater Hastings is geographically large, and spread over three distinct sites, which means there is always something going on. The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers seem to be few at times.

Currently we would particularly benefit from a Parish Treasurer.

Who I am (the being), and what I do as a Vicar/however cannot be done without your support. I want to Thank You for your support and your prayers as Alister and I get on with our roles. I particularly want to thank the Non-Stipended Clergy for all they do to support faith communities and the Parish as a whole.

Gordon Ernest Vogtherr 26 October 1926 - 15 March 2024

On the 20th of March the funeral for **Gordon Ernest Vogtherr** was held at St Matthew's. Along with Shirley, his wife of over 70 years, Gordon actively shared in the life of this parish for many decades. Gordon was one of the last survivors of the Hawke's Bay earthquake. In that he encapsulated our history.

Gordon possessed a strong work ethic, which isn't surprising as he began working at the Bacon Factory from the age of 8 – his first and only job. And from that came his desire to serve the wider community, to serve this parish, and most of all, to provide well for his

By character he was tenacious and single minded, and whatever he did, he did to the best of his ability – which included his passion for cars and, in earlier years, his running. Gordon lived life to the full.

Joan May Morrison MBE, 30355 NZWRAC Capt. 31 May 1923 - 29 June 2024

On the 29th June the funeral of **Joan May Morrison** was held at St Matthew's. Joan was born in Masterton on a dairy & egg farm in Te Ore Ore. She joined the army on the 5th of March 1943, working her way through the ranks to become Captain in 1953. She was awarded the MBE for her services to the NZ Women's Army, presented by Queen Elizabeth when she visited New Zealand in 1970.



She had a career as a Matron at the nursing home in Wellington and then at various colleges, until her retirement. A keen golfer and member of the old Mangateretere Golf Club, a supporter of Forest and Bird, her property in Tollemache Road was and still is used as a nursery for native plants. She was also a very keen tramper and longtime volunteer at St Matthew's Church. Always very independent throughout her life, she continued driving until well into her 90s. May she rest in peace and rise in glory.




