You are the source of all life and goodness; through your eternal Word you have created all things from the beginning.

When we sinned and turned away you called us back to yourself and gave your Son to share our human nature.

In him the light which shines for all has come into the world, and he has become one with us that we may become one with you.

In him you have made us a holy people by sending upon us your holy and lifegiving Spirit.

Therefore we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

# Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

On the night before he died, Your Son, Jesus Christ, took bread; when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them and said:
Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember me.

Therefore loving God, recalling your great goodness to us in Christ, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation.

Send your Holy Spirit that these gifts of bread and wine which we receive may be to us the body and blood of Christ, and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power, may be renewed for the service of your kingdom.

United in Christ with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, O God, in songs of everlasting praise.

Blessing, honour and glory be yours, here and everywhere now and forever.

## The Lord's Prayer

#### The Invitation to Communion

Communion will be served at standing stations at the Sanctuary steps - all are welcome to receive the bread and wine at communion, (however please note that intinction, ie dipping the wafer into the wine chalice, is **NOT** permitted); although you are welcome to receive the bread only if you prefer, or to come forward for a blessing only.

If you need communion served to you in your seat, please indicate to the servers.

When all who wish to have received communion, we remain seated to sing:

- 1 Away in a manger, no crib for a bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head. The stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay, the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.
- The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes, but little Lord Jesus no crying he makes. I love you, Lord Jesus! Look down from the sky, and stay by my side until morning is nigh.
- Be near me, Lord Jesus; I ask you to stay close by me forever, and love me, I pray.

  Bless all the dear children in your tender care, and fit us for heaven, to live with you there.

# **Prayer after Communion**

Welcome, welcome, Jesus Christ our infant saviour, baby who makes every birth holy.

May we, who like the shepherds have witnessed in the stable a new kind of love, return to our work with joy.

May we, for whom the heavens have opened to proclaim that God is with us, we who have fed on living bread and drunk the wine of heaven, go out to be instruments of your peace, day by day. Amen
