- Christ ascends to God! Behold him here, where earth and heaven meet. Unimagined powers enfold him, mortals worship at his feet. Alleluia, Alleluia! all his mission now complete.
- God receives him into mystery clouds of glory veil the sight; no more bound to human history, strong as love and free as light.
   Alleluia, Alleluia! now to reign in his own right.

#### Psalm 97 (ANZPB)

- <sup>1</sup> You are king O Lord, let the earth be glad: let the many islets and coastlands rejoice.
- <sup>2</sup> Clouds and darkness are round about you: righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne.
- <sup>3</sup> Fire goes before you: and burns up your enemies on every side.
- <sup>4</sup> The world is lit up by your lightnings: and earth trembles at the sight.
- <sup>5</sup> The mountains melt like wax before you: before the Lord of all the earth.
- <sup>6</sup> The heavens proclaim your righteousness: and all the peoples see your glory.
- <sup>7</sup> Shame on all who worship images, and glory in their worthless idols: bow down before the Lord all you gods.
- <sup>8</sup> Jerusalem hears and is glad: the cities of Judah rejoice O Lord at your judgments.

#### **Reading:** Revelation 22: 12-14, 16-17, 20-21 Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church. Thanks be to God. O Sovereign God! With joyful sound Gospel Hymn: Psalm 97, after the paraphrase by David G. Preston Tune: **DUNEDIN** (Where mountains rise to open skies) O sovereign God! With joyful sound 1 let all the earth in you delight, whom cloud and deepest dark surround, whose throne is justice, truth and right. Before you fires of justice go, 2 your lightnings blaze your advent forth, the mountains melt like wax, and flow before the Ruler of the earth. Your righteousness the heavens proclaim, 3 with glory all the peoples see; the pagan world is put to shame: to you all gods must bow the knee. Your people hear; with joy they cry 4 to see the judgments you ordain for you alone are God Most High, and far above all gods you reign. Let everyone who loves your word 5 hate evil, as your law commands; your faithful people you will guard, deliv'ring them from wicked hands. 6 So light will shine upon the just, and joy on hearts kept clear of blame, who gladly place in you their trust,
