On Sunday 1 June I received the resignation of Mark Hensman.

'I regretfully write to inform you that, for personal reasons, I am resigning from my role as Lay Minister in Greater Hastings.

This decision is to be effective from midnight on Friday 6th June.'

I acknowledged receipt of Mark's resignation on the same day, but did not accept it until after he had met with Archbishop John in Vancouver and had reported back to me. In consultation with Archbishop John, Mark has decided not to seek Ordination. On Friday 6 June with sadness and regret I accepted Mark's resignation.

We have been working through this pastorally for some time and we will continue to do so.

For The Anglican Parish of Greater Hastings this will mean that during the months of June and July we will need to accept that we cannot meet all demands but will continue to do our best for God.

In August and September we will need to take stock and reflect on where we are heading and how we wish to do that.

It will be helpful to have in mind Te Ngahere Puawai: A Vision For The Flourishing of Waiapu. It will also be helpful for us to think about what we want the Parish to look like in 5-10 years rather than focus on our needs right now.

Over the last 12 months we have seen significant changes in our human resource pool, and I have come to see this as a God-given gift to look forward to what God is calling us to be and do at this time in history, 2025 – 2035.

I will use my time travelling to see what is happening on a more global scale and on my return work with the Wardens and Ministry Team on a process for Vestry to reflect on where we are heading and how we wish to do that.

Pastoral Care

As many parishioners are aware, we have experienced some major changes with personnel and ministries in recent months. We previously had two full-time stipendiary priests with four retired non-stipendiary clergy available to undertake various ministry roles in the Parish; we now have the equivalent of one-and-a-half roles. As a result, we are currently exploring and redistributing resources and responsibilities, being aware that we cannot continue covering everything the same as in the past.

The ministry of all the baptised is to love and care for one another, and recognising that, the Wardens and Clergy ask that if you, or someone you know, become unwell, or require Home Communion, or a residential care/rest-home visit, PLEASE, pass the information direct (in confidence) to Prasadi in the Parish Office, or contact the Clergy, or a Warden.

If you are hospitalised, or know of a parishioner in hospital, your first point of contact for Pastoral Care is the Hospital Chaplain (you become their 'parishioner' whilst in hospital); but if you wish to have a visit from one of the Greater Hastings Parish Clergy, please let us know.


Mānawatia a Matariki!
