A little bit of history......








The first Anglican service in Hastings was held in 1869 at Frimley Homestead, the residence of J.N. Williams. Services later moved to a school on St Aubyn Street, before the first St Matthew's Church was built in 1877 on the corner of Heretaunga and King Streets. With its twin towers, this wooden church bore a strong resemblance to Westminster Abbey. As Hastings grew, a new site was purchased on King Street in 1884, and the wooden part of the present church was consecrated on 31 March 1886. Then on 27 Sept 1895, Synod passed the motion to establish the Parish of Hastings, St Matthew's.

Major extensions in 1914–15 added transepts, a chapel, vestries, and a tower, built in concrete and designed in a modern Gothic style. The 1931 Hawke's Bay earthquake caused significant damage, but the church was repaired and reopened in 1932.

Through all these changes, St Matthew's has remained a place of worship, service, and community - a living witness to faith.

Today we give thanks for 130 years of history, resilience, and God's blessing in Hastings.
