Blessing the Advent Wreath

Gracious God,

Lighting the First Candle - Hope

Today is the first Sunday in Advent.

Advent is a time of waiting and preparing to celebrate Jesus' birth. It is also a time for us to work together for peace among the nations, and peace with each other. It is a time for us to walk in the light God gives us.

As part of our Advent waiting, each week we will light a candle in our Advent wreath - this first candle is to remind us of the hope this season brings. The round shape of the wreath reminds us of the unbroken love of God. The green branches speak of new life. The candles remind us of the light which came into the world with Jesus.

Today, we light the first candle.
The flickering flame reminds us that our hope is lived out in prayer and action; and so together we pray:

Loving God, through your Spirit,
you spoke to your prophets in ages past
of a vision of peace.
You spoke to Mary and Joseph
of a child who would bring new life to the world.
Speak to each of us this day
and fill us with Advent hope
as we prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth. Amen.

The first candle on the Advent Wreath is lit, then we stand to sing:

Light a candle bright and tall for the Hope within our world. Hope that heard the ages' call as the stars and planets whirled. Shine within our hearts today Come, O Hope, to us, we pray.

The Great Thanksgiving

The Lord is here. **God's Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to offer thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and everlasting Father, through Jesus Christ your Son.

For when he humbled himself to come among us in human flesh, he fulfilled the plan you formed before the foundation of the world to open for us the way of salvation.

Confident that your promise will be fulfilled, we now watch for the day when Christ our Lord will come again in glory.

And so we join our voices with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven to proclaim your glory for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

To you indeed be glory, almighty God, because on the night before he died, your Son, Jesus Christ, took bread; when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said:

Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them and said:
This cup is the new covenant in my blood poured out for you; do this as often as you drink it to remember me.

God of hope and joy, we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. With this bread and this cup we proclaim the mystery of our faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come in glory.

Therefore, loving God, recalling now Christ's death and resurrection, we ask you to accept this our sacrifice of praise.

Send your Holy Spirit upon us and our celebration, that we may be fed with the body and blood of your Son and be filled with your life and goodness. Strengthen us to do your work, and to be your body in the world.

Unite us in Christ and give us your peace.

May we praise you and give you glory through your First-born, Jesus Christ.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, in your holy Church, we worship you, O God, in songs of everlastings praise.

Blessing, honour and glory be yours, here and everywhere, now and forever. Amen.

Closing Hymn: We have a Gospel to Proclaim


