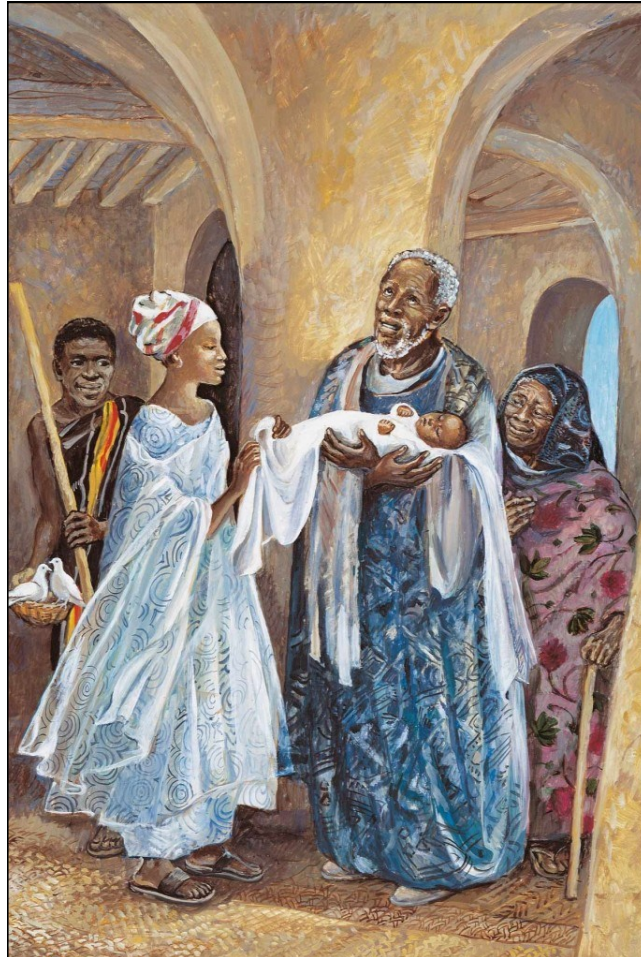

The Gathering

The Presider may greet the people informally before continuing

Grace and peace to you from God.

God fill you with truth and joy.

Dear friends, forty days ago we celebrated the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Now we recall the day on which he was presented in the Temple, when he was offered to the Father and shown to his people. As a sign of his coming among us, his mother was purified, as we now come to him for cleansing and renewal.

In their old age, Simeon and Anna recognized him as their Lord, as we today sing of his glory.

In this Eucharist, we celebrate both the joy of his coming and his searching judgement, looking back to the day of his birth and forward to the coming days of his passion.

And so, together, we say ...

**Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to God's people on earth.**

**Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

Prayers of Penitence

Hear the words of our Saviour Jesus Christ:

‘I am the light of the world.

Whoever follows me shall never walk in darkness
but shall have the light of life.’

Let us therefore bring our sins into his light
and confess them in penitence and faith. *John 8.12*

Silence

Eternal God, giver of light and grace,
we have sinned against you
and against our neighbour,
in what we have thought,
in what we have said and done,
through ignorance, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.
We have wounded your love,
and marred your image in us.
We are sorry and ashamed,
and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
who died for us, forgive us all that is past;
and lead us out from darkness
to walk as children of light. **Amen.**

Presider:

Almighty God,
who forgives all who truly repent,
have mercy upon you,
pardon and deliver you from all your sins,
confirm and strengthen you in all goodness,
and keep you in life eternal;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

Let us pray that we may know
and share the light of Christ.

Silence

Collect:

Ever-living God, your Son Jesus Christ
was presented as a child in the temple
to be the hope of your people;
grant us pure hearts and minds
that we may be transformed into his likeness,
who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,
one God for ever.
Amen.

Reading: **Malachi 3: 1-5**

After the Reading: Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church.
Thanks be to God.

Psalm 24: 7-10

- 7 Lift up your heads you gates,
lift yourselves up, you everlasting doors:
that the king of glory may come in.
- 8 'Who is the king of glory?':
**'It is the Lord strong and mighty,
the Lord who is mighty in battle.'**
- 9 Lift up your heads you gates,

that the king of glory may come in.
- 10 'Who is the king of glory?':
**'It is the Lord, the Lord of hosts who
is the king of glory.'**

Affirmation of Faith - The Apostles' Creed

**I believe in God,

born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.**

The Blessing of Candles

*The Presider blesses the candles to be used on the altar during the year,
and the candles for distribution to the congregation*

Presider: Forty days ago we celebrated the joyful feast of the
birth of our Lord Jesus Christ.
Today we recall the holy day on which he was presented
in the Temple, fulfilling the law of Moses,
and at the same time going to meet his faithful people.
Led by the Spirit, Simeon and Anna came to the temple,
recognized Christ as their Lord,
and proclaimed him with joy.

United by the same Spirit,
we gather in this house of God
and welcome Christ the Lord.
Here we shall recognize him in the breaking of bread
until he comes again in glory.

Let us pray:

Almighty God, source of all light,
today you revealed to Simeon
your Light of revelation to the nations.
Bless + these candles and make them holy,
that we who observe their light in your temple
may come with joy to the light of glory.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.
Amen.

The Preparation of the Gifts

Creator God, in Christ there has sprung up a light
for the righteous;
accept the gifts we bring before you
and grant that Christ may shine in us
to the praise and glory of your name.
Amen.

The Great Thanksgiving

The Lord is here.
God's Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to offer thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and good, always and everywhere,
to give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ,
who is one with you from all eternity.

For on this day he appeared in the Temple
in substance of our flesh
to come near to us in judgement.
He searches the hearts of all your people
and brings to light the image of your splendour.

Your servant Simeon acclaimed him as the light
to lighten the nations,
while Anna spoke of him to all who looked for your
redemption.

Destined for the falling and rising of many,
he was lifted high upon the cross
and a sword of sorrow pierced his mother's heart
when, by his sacrifice, he made our peace with you.
And now we rejoice and glorify your name
that we, too, have seen your salvation
and join with angels and archangels
in their unending hymn of praise:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

All glory and thanksgiving to you, holy Father;
on the night before he died
your Son, Jesus Christ, took bread;
when he had given you thanks,
he broke it, gave it to his disciples,
and said:

Take, eat, this is my body
which is given for you;
do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup;
when he had given you thanks,
he gave it to them and said:
Drink this, all of you,
for this is my blood of the new covenant
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins;
do this as often as you drink it,
to remember me.

Therefore loving God,
recalling your great goodness to us in Christ,
we celebrate our redemption
with this bread of life
and this cup of salvation.

Send your Holy Spirit
that these gifts of bread and wine which we receive
may be to us the body and blood of Christ,
and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power,
may be renewed for the service of your kingdom.

United in Christ with all who stand before you
in earth and heaven,
we worship you, O God,
in songs of everlasting praise.

**Blessing, honour and glory be yours,
here and everywhere, now and for ever. Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

Believing the promises of God,
as our Saviour Christ taught us, so we pray ...

**Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.**

**Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial
and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours
now and for ever. Amen.**

We break the bread of life,
and that life is the light of the world.
**God here among us,
light in the midst of us,
bring us to light and life.**

The Invitation to Communion

Haere mai e te kāhui a te Atua,
tangohia ēnei kai rangatira a te Karaiti.
Come God's people, come to receive Christ's heavenly food.

*Communion will be served at standing stations at the Sanctuary steps - all are welcome to receive the bread and wine at communion, (however please note that intinction, ie dipping the wafer into the wine chalice, is **NOT** permitted); although you are welcome to receive the bread only if you prefer, or to come forward for a blessing only.*

If you need communion served to you in your seat, please indicate to the servers.

After receiving the bread and wine, please collect a Votive candle to take home, where you may wish to light it as a reminder that Christ is the 'Light of the World'.



Prayer after Communion

God our heavenly Father, source of all light,
you revealed to aged Simeon your light
that enlightens all nations
and have now filled our hearts
with the light of faith through this holy supper.
**Lighten our path that we may walk in the way of holiness
until we come to the Light that shines forever, your Son,
Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

Closing Litany and Blessing

Presider: Loving God, here we bring to an end
our celebration of the Saviour's birth.
**Help us, in whom he has been born,
to live his life that has no end.**

Here we have offered the Church's sacrifice of praise.
**Help us, who have received the bread of life,
to be thankful for your gift.**

Here we have rejoiced with faithful Simeon and Anna.
**Help us, who have found the Lord in his temple,
to trust in your eternal promises.**

Here we have greeted the light of the world.
**Help us, when we light our candles,
to remember never to forsake the light of Christ.**

Here we stand near the place of baptism.
**Help us, who are marked with the cross,
to share the Lord's death and resurrection.**

Here we turn from Christ's birth to his passion.
**Help us, for whom Lent is near,
to enter deeply into the Easter mystery.**

Here, may Christ the Son be manifest to you,
that your lives may be a light to the world;
and the blessing of God almighty,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
be with you and remain with you for ever.
Amen.
