

**Order of Service for the
Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Presider: This is the day which the Lord has made.
Ko te rā tēnei i hangā e lhowā.
Let us rejoice and be glad in it.
Kia hari, kia koa tātou.

God of justice, love and peace,
source and end of human knowledge,
God whose grace shall never cease.
Celebrate the Maker's glory -
power to rescue and release.

heals the sick, upsets religion,
fearless both of fate and cost.
Celebrate Christ's constant presence -
friend and stranger, guest and host.

The Gathering of the Community

The presiding priest may greet the people informally, then continues

E te whānau a te Karaiti,
welcome to this holy table;
welcome to you,
for we are Christ's body,
Christ's work in the world.

Welcome to you whose baptism makes you
salt of the earth and light to the world.
Rejoice and be glad.

Praise God who gives us forgiveness and hope.

Amen. Christ is our light, the joy of our salvation.

Praise and glory to Christ,
God's new beginning for humanity
making ritual water gospel wine,
cleansing all our worship.

Love and loyalty to Christ, who gives us the gospel.

Praise to Christ who calls us to holiness.

Song of Praise

Christ is the living water
cleansing, refreshing, making all things new.
Christ is the living bread;
food for the hungry,
strength for the pilgrim and the labourer.

**So now we offer our thanks
for the beauty of these islands;
for the wild places and the bush,

We come seeking forgiveness

Silence

In God there is forgiveness.

and where our thoughts and actions have been
contrary to yours we ask your pardon.**

The presiding priest says

Mā te Atua e muru ō koutou hara; kia mau te rongo.
God forgives us; be at peace.

Silence

Rejoice and be glad,
for Christ is resurrection,
reconciliation for all the human race.

**We shall all be one in Christ,
one in our life together.
Praise to God who has created us,
praise to God who has accepted us,
praise to God who sends us into the world.**

Sentence:

‘Is not this the fast that I choose,’ says the Lord:
‘to loose the bonds of injustice,
and to let the oppressed go free?’ *Isaiah 58:6*

Collect: We praise you, God,
**that the light of Christ shines in our darkness
and is never overcome;**
show us the way we must go to eternal day;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reading: **Isaiah 58: 1-9a (9b-12)** - *The fast that God chooses*

After the reading: Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church.
Thanks be to God.

Psalm 112: 1-10 (ANZPB)

¹ Whakamoemititia a Ihowā. / Praise the Lord.
Blessèd are those who fear the Lord:
and greatly delight in God's commandments.

² **Their descendants will be mighty in the land:
the children of the upright will be blessed.**

³ Riches and plenty shall fill their houses:
righteousness shall be theirs for ever.

⁴ **They are a light in the darkness for the upright:
being gracious compassionate and just.**

⁵ It goes well with those who are generous in lending:
who conduct their affairs with justice.

⁶ **For the righteous will never be shaken:
they will be kept in remembrance for ever.**

All standing, the presiding priest says to the people

The Great Thanksgiving

*It is recommended that the people stand or kneel throughout the following prayer,
however you are welcome to sit*

The presiding priest says

Christ is risen!
He is risen indeed.

Lift your hearts to heaven
where Christ in glory reigns.

Let us give thanks to God.
It is right to offer thanks and praise.

Ko te hari mō tō mātou whakaoranga,
e te Atua o Tua-whakarere,
ki te tuku whakawhetai ki a koe
i roto i a Īhu Karaiti.

It is the joy of our salvation,
God of the universe,
to give you thanks
through Jesus Christ.

Pāho ana tāu kupu,
'Kia tīaho te mārama';
nā, ka mārama.
E tīaho tonu nei tōu māramatanga
i roto i tō mātou pōuri.
Nāu i pou te mauri-ora mō
ngā mea katoa.

Nāu hoki mātou i waihanga,
ki te whakarongo ki tāu kupu,
ki te mahi i tāu i pai ai,
kia eke ai ki te taumata o tōu aroha.
He mea tika kia whakapaingia koe.

Nāu i tono mai tāu Tama
hei ara whainga mā mātou,
hei pono e manakohia ana e mātou.

I tukua mai e koe tāu Tama
kia whakamatea hei toha i te ora,
hei wewete i ō mātou hara.
Kua unuhia ō mātou hē e tōna rīpeka.
I tonoa mai tōu Wairua Tapu
hei whakakaha, hei arataki,
hei whakatūpato, hei whakahou
i tāu Hāhi.

Waihoki, i tēnei rōpū whakaatu

i te ngākau aroha, i te ngākau hari,
mōu i waihanga, i karanga i a mātou,

**E te Atua tapu rawa, mahi tohu,
tino tapu, tino tika,
nōu te korōria, nōu te purotu.
Korōria ki a koe, e te Atua,
te Runga rawa, te Atua māhaki.**

You said,
'Let there be light';
there was light.
Your light shines on
in our darkness.
For you the earth has brought forth
life in all its forms.

You have created us
to hear your Word,
to do your will
and to be fulfilled in your love.
It is right to thank you.

You sent your Son to be for us
the way we need to follow
and the truth we need to know.

You sent your Son
to give his life
to release us from our sin.
His cross has taken our guilt away.
You send your Holy Spirit
to strengthen and to guide,
to warn and to revive
your Church.

Therefore, with all your witnesses
who surround us on every side,
countless as heaven's stars,

we praise you for our creation
and our calling,
with loving and with joyful hearts:

**Holy God, holy and merciful,
holy and just,
glory and goodness come from you.
Glory to you most high
and gracious God.**

E te tino Tapu, ka whakapaingia koe,
i roto i tāu Tama
i tuohu nei ki te horoi i ngā wae
o āna ākonga,
te tohu o te kaimahi tūturu.

I te pō i mua i tōna matenga
ka tango ia i te taro ka tuku
whakawhetai ki a koe.
Ka whawhati, ka hoatu ki āna ākonga,
ā ka mea:
Tangohia, kainga, ko tōku tinana tēnei
ka hoatu nei mō koutou; meinga
tēnei hei whakamahara ki ahau.

Ka mutu te hapa, ka mau ia i te kapu,

ka hoatu ki a rātou, ā, ka mea:
Inumia tēnei, ko ōku toto
o te Kawenata hou
i whakahekea mōu, mō te katoa,
hei murunga hara, meinga tēnei

**Te Atua o ngā wā katoa,

mō tōna whakareanga.**
**Ka tūmanako ki tōna haerenga mai
i runga i te korōria,**
**I roto i a ia, ka mau tonu mātou
ki a koe.**

Blessed are you, most holy,
in your Son,
who washed his disciples' feet.
'I am among you,' he said,
'as one who serves.'

On that night before he died
he took bread
and gave you thanks.
He broke it, gave it to his disciples,
and said:
Take, eat, this is my body
which is given for you;
do this to remember me.

After supper, he took the cup,
and gave you thanks.
He gave it to them and said:
Drink this. It is my blood
of the new covenant,
shed for you, shed for all,
to forgive sin;
do this to remember me.

Therefore with this bread and wine
we recall
your goodness to us.

**God of the past and present, we
your people remember your Son.
We thank you
for his cross
and rising again,
we take courage from his
ascension;
we look for his coming
in glory
and in him we give ourselves
to you.**

Whakahāngia iho tōu Wairua Tapu,
Meatia tēnei taro, ko te tinana tonu,
tēnei waina, ko ngā toto tonu
o te Karaiti.

Kia tūhono ki tōna tinana,
Kia ū ai mātou ki roto i te aka pono.

**Ka aru mātou i a te Karaiti,
Tui, tui, tuituia mātou.
Tuia ki te mamae.
Tuia ki te tūmanako,
Tui, tui, tuia ki te ora.**

Kei a koe, e te tapu o te rangi,
te orokohanga rā anō o te ao,
te tīmatanga, te otinga,
te ārepa me te ūmekā.

**Kei a koe, te whakapai, te korōria,
te aroha,
I tēnei rā, i tēnā rā,
Mai i a mātou, mai i te katoa,
I konei, i ngā wāhi katoa. Āmine.**

ka īnoi tatou

**E tō mātou Matua i te rangi
Kia tapu tōu Ingoa.
Kia tae mai tōu rangatiratanga.
Kia meatia tāu e pai ai
ki runga ki te whenua,
kia rite anō ki tō te rangi.
Hōmai ki a mātou āianei
he taro mā mātou mō tēnei rā.
Murua ū mātou hara,
Me mātou hoki e muru nei
i ū te hunga e hara ana ki a mātou.**

Send your Holy Spirit,
that we who receive Christ's body
may indeed be the body of Christ,
and we who share his cup
draw strength from
the one true vine.

**Called to follow Christ,
help us to reconcile and unite.
Called to suffer,
give us hope
in our calling.**

For you, the heavenly one,
make all things new;
you are the beginning and the end,
the last and the first.

**Praise, glory and love
be yours,
this and every day,
from us and all people,
here and everywhere. Amen.**

As Christ teaches us
we pray

**Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.**

Give us today our daily bread.

**Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin
against us.**

All are welcome to receive the bread and wine at communion, however please note that Intinction (ie dipping the wafer into the wine chalice) is **NOT permitted**; although you are welcome to receive the bread only if you prefer, or to come forward for a blessing only.

If you need communion served to you in your seat, please indicate to the servers.

Blessed are you, God of the universe.

You have created us, and given us life.

Blessed are you, God of the planet earth.

**You have set our world like a radiant jewel in the heavens,
and filled it with action, beauty, suffering,
struggle and hope.**

**in all the peoples who live here,
in all the lessons we have learned,
in all that remains for us to do.**

Blessed are you because you need us;
because you make us worthwhile,
