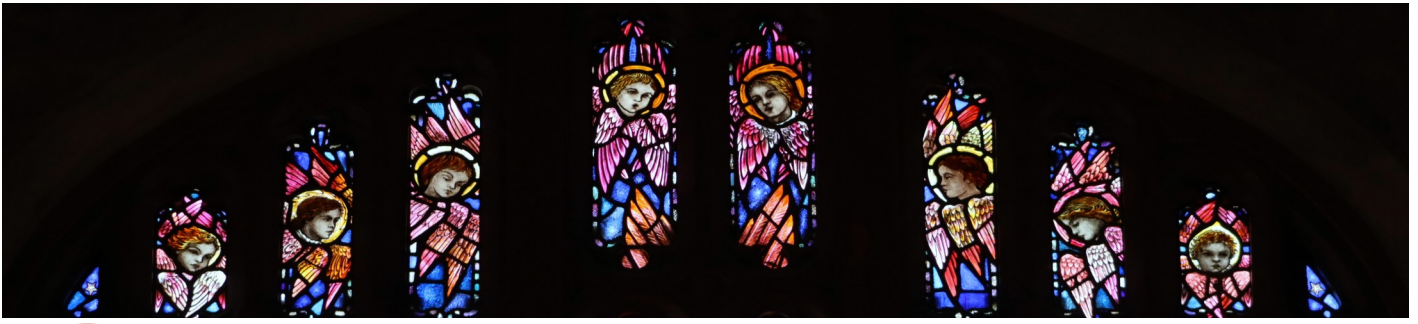

- **Winter Solstice** - Here in Aotearoa, June brings us to the winter solstice, the shortest day and longest night of the year. As the southern hemisphere tilts away from the sun, we experience the deep chill of mid-winter. It is a profound time to light candles, acknowledging Christ as our light in the darkness, and to pray for those finding winter difficult.

- On 29th June, we celebrate the **Patronal Festival of St Peter**, Apostle & Martyr.

We observe this feast because Peter represents the very human journey of faith - full of fierce loyalty, tragic failure, and ultimate restoration. As a foundational pillar of the early Church who witnessed unto death, Peter's life reminds our parish that Christ uses ordinary, flawed people to build His Kingdom. Celebrating him inspires us to renew our own apostolic mission right here in Greater Hastings.

- Across the Parish we have many and varied Faith Communities. These congregations read and reflect on the Bible, pray together, and most share Communion.

You are encouraged to experience the depth and breadth of this diversity by attending a Faith Community other than your usual.

Most **Mondays** of Term Time at **10.30am** Waiapu Kids have 20 minutes of Bible story and conversation including prayers and songs in the Lady Chapel.

Thursday at 10.15am we gather for Eucharist in the Lady Chapel, a unique weekly Faith Community.

Every 2nd **Friday** of Term Time at 1.40pm the Primary School has School Chapel which includes Bible story and message, prayers and songs offered by the students, and Eucharist.

On **Sundays** at **St Matthew's**, we have Eucharist at 8am which is a said service with no music, and at 10am with a variety of music throughout the month.

At **St Peter's** we have 10am (except the 2nd & 5th Sundays when we combine at St Matthew's) which also has a variety of music.

Please give a Congregation other than your 'normal' a go!

We have a wide **Rest Home Ministry** attending weekly or monthly in several residential care facilities in Hastings. If you or your family and whanau member resides in one of these homes, please join with us.

Soon we will also gather to cry **Mānawatia a Matariki—Hail Matariki!** As the Pleiades star cluster rises, it signals the welcome of the Māori New Year. For us as a New Zealand church, observing Matariki is a beautiful way to honour our bicultural heritage. It provides a sacred space to remember those who have passed (te hunga mate), celebrate the present harvest with thanksgiving, and look forward with hope to the future. It perfectly aligns with our Christian call to stewardship and community.

Abundant Blessings

'Music for the Soul' spans decades of inspirational music and invites the audience to experience the universal power of the human spirit.

The first half of the afternoon pays tribute to the grand traditions of The Tabernacle Choir at Temple Square. Featuring the majestic Mack Wilberg arrangements of *Amazing Grace* and *Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing*, the program opens with a cinematic sweep. From the intimate, tear-streaked history of *It Is Well with My Soul* to the quiet, modern wisdom of *Slow Down and Consider the Lilies*, these songs provide a steadying anchor for the heart. The section culminates in the thunderous, triumphant energy of the *Battle Hymn of the Republic*.



In the second half of the concert, the atmosphere shifts into the vibrant, high-energy world of Gospel.

This section celebrates the raw, soulful expression of faith and perseverance. The audience will be moved by the delicate beauty of *His Eye Is on the Sparrow* and the poignant storytelling of *Alabaster Box*, before being swept up in the modern, infectious grooves of Kirk Franklin's *I Smile and Love Theory*.
